Chapter 1

Origins of family in Shropshire and Worcestershire - Hugh Peplowe of Chaddesley Corbett - William Underhill and Humphrey Peplowe prosecuted for digging up the Kings Highway - the family move to Dawley in Shropshire - John Peplow, the fanatical parson of Penkridge - Podmore Peplow and his four sons - Jonathan Peplow, sword cutler to the Duke of Gloucester - the legend of Richard Peplow - Samuel Peplow enters the church and marries into the Browne family.

Chapter 2

The Battle of Preston - Samuel Peplow made Warden of Manchester and subsequently Bishop of Chester - his portrait by Hamlet Winstanley.

Chapter 3

Bishop Peplow meets with strife in Manchester - Samuel Peplow Junior and his appointments - marries into the Birch family - William Peplow, nephew to the Bishop - Bishop Peplow dies and his will.

Chapter 4

Bishop Peplow's daughter Mary marries Francis Jodrell - she rebuilds the Archdeacon's House in Chester - Samuel Peplow Junior's infant son John inherits Garnstone from this uncle and has to take the name Birch - family coat of arms - the Peplow family of Acton Trussell and Bednall - Bishop Peplow's daughter Elizabeth and the Bradshaw family - John Peplow Birch marries into the wealthy Clowes family of Manchester - Peplow Junior has his portrait painted by Gainsborough - John Peplow Birch's daughter Anne marries into the Webb family - John Peplow Birch's son Samuel marries into the Cornwall family of Moccas Court - Samuel and Kitty held captive in Paris - Kitty Peplow's singing and her connections to Haydn and Mozart - John Peplow Birch dies at Garnstone

Chapter 5

Garnstone rebuilt by John Nash - Lady Duff-Gordon's diaries - Samuel's cow painted by Weaver - Samuel Peplow and his trips to Italy - his Webb nephews and nieces - John Birch Webb takes over the parish of Kings Pyon and Weobley - John Birch Webb marries Annie Molyneux - their family life at Weobley - Samuel Peplow dies in 1845 leaving Garnstone to his nephew Daniel Peplow Webb

Chapter 6

Daniel Peplow Webb becomes Captain Peplow of Garnstone and quarters the Peplow arms with that of Webb - he employs Nesfield to redesign gardens at Garnstone - his character - the children of John Birch Webb and Annie - he builds Kings Pyon House - Webb-Peplow family - the family in the Crimean War - Augustus Webb marries Fanny Curtis - Croome family - young Daniel Peplow Webb marries Leila Metcalfe.

Chapter 7

The Metcalfe family of Delhi - Captain Daniel Peplow and his relationship with his tenants - not popular with his family - dies in 1866 leaving the Garnstone estate in perfect order - Miss Webb of Chesham Place - Weobley Church restored by Hanmer Webb-Peplow - Garnstone modernised by Rev John Birch Webb and Annie who take the name of Peplow - further improvements to the gardens - John Birch Peplow dies at Garnstone.

Chapter 8

Ella Peplow/Webb marries the Rev William Hutchinson - Dan and Leila and their family take over Garnstone - their daughter dies at Brighton - Dan becomes M.P. for Herefordshire - the Herefordshire Bow Meeting - Lady Duff-Gordon dies - Shooting parties at Garnstone - Hal Peplow and his younger brother Fitz - another daughter named Winnie born to Dan and Leila at Garnstone - Capel Molyneux - Leila and her harp - Annie Peplow (formerly Webb) dies at her son Hanmer's house in London - Dan defeated in the election of 1880.

Chapter 9

Dan becomes involved in shaky business deals in America - coming of age festivities of Hal Peplow - Dan mortgages the Garnstone estate and pushes Hal to sign a disentailing deed - the Iron business requires more and more money - the Peplow family lose considerable amounts of money and try to let out Garnstone - Fitz sent to America - Augustus Webb dies - Peplow family move to Florence partially to save money and partially to help Dan's health - Fitz takes up sculpture - Dan dies whilst walking through Florence.

Chapter 10

Hal inherits and tries to save Garnstone - he marries Sydney Chapman - Fitz becomes a successful sculptor in New York - he becomes engaged to Anna Duryea but she dies soon after of typhoid - Hal decides to sell Garnstone after the complete failure of his father's Iron and Steel business.

Chapter 11

Family move to Underriver House near Sevenoaks - Fitz dies in America followed by his mother - Winnie Peplow marries Cyril Roberts the artist - Keith Peplow killed at the Somme - Dan Peplow marries Lady Dorothy Bligh.
